Students entering the First through Sixth grades may register for The Calvary Christian School Summer School. This is a Bible-based program that consists of Chapel time, academic review, physical activities, as well as off-campus. Our summer staff consists of qualified teachers.

Parents may enroll their child in the program by mail or in person. A separate registration form must be completed for each student accompanied by full payment. Registration forms and checks, made payable to CCCS, should be mailed or delivered to: Calvary Chapel Christian School, 98-1016 Komo Mai Drive, Aiea, HI 96701.

Registration for the program is open on a first-come, first-served basis. There is a limited enrollment. Parents are encouraged to register promptly to ensure their child's placement in the program. The registration deadline is Monday, June 12, 2023. There is a Late Registration fee of \$50.00.

TUITION AND FEES

The Summer school program, which includes instructional materials and fees for excursions, and other activities is \$750/Student. TKDO \$650 if your child is enrolled in Summer school the TKDO fee is \$600

WITHDRAWALS/REFUNDS

No refunds will be given after the payment has been made, and there will be no pro-rating of days due to vacations, absences, etc. Calvary Chapel Christian School reserves the right to withdraw a student for disciplinary and any other reasons after the program has begun without any refund.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

All CCCS students should be current on their vaccinations.

SUMMER SCHOOL SCHEDULE

Monday thru Friday 8:00 am – 2 pm. Mon, June 19, 2023 thru Fri, July 28, 2023. No summer school on Tuesday, July 4, 2023 in observance of Independence Day.

TKDO SUMMER SCHOOL SCHEDULE Monday thru Thursday 1:00pm – 3:00pm. Mon, June 19, 2023 thru Fri, July 21, 2023. No TKDO class on Tuesday, July 4, 2023 in observance of Independence Day.

No child should be dropped off any earlier than 7:45 am and left unsupervised on campus. Children **MUST** be picked up no later than 2:15pm. Students who are not picked up by their parents by 2:15 pm will be charged a late fee of \$50 per every minute. Payment is due at time of pick-up. The CCCS Summer School program **does not** offer school enrichment programs before or after school hours.

ABSENCES AND TARDINESS

Parents or legal guardians should report any absences to the School Office (524.0846) by 9:00 a.m. Tardy students who arrive after 8:00 am must report to their classroom. For absences known ahead of time, a written note of absence should be sent to the School Office.

DISCIPLINE AND EXPECTED BEHAVIOR

All students are expected to behave appropriately inside and outside of the classrooms adhering to principles established in the Bible and showing respect and courtesy to fellow students and adults. Students who have difficulty adjusting to the social climate and expectations of the school may be dismissed from the program without any refund.

DRESS CODE

CCCS uniforms are not required to be worn during Summer School. However, we expect our students to look neat and clean and to wear appropriate attire. All students are required to wear shoes. Slippers are not permitted. Extreme hairstyles or clothes are not acceptable. Modesty is the best policy, thus we expect children to cover appropriately.

Appropriate attire for girls includes skirts, walking shorts (all no shorter than 3" above the knee), T-shirts, collared shirts, pants, and athletic shoes. The following is unacceptable attire: oversized clothing; tank tops, grubby T-shirts, crop tops, tops that look like undershirts; shirts advertising cigarettes, alcohol or drugs; shirts with obscene language or pictures and words with double meanings contrary to CCCS's Christian philosophy; tight or short shorts; cut-offs; shorts or pants with frayed edges; bare-midriff; slippers; extreme hairstyles or unnatural colors.

Appropriate attire for boys includes t-shirts, collared shirts, long pants, walking shorts (no shorter than 3" above the knee), and athletic shoes. Hair must be neatly trimmed and should not extend below the nape of the neck or hang into the eyes. The following is unacceptable attire: oversized clothing tank tops; grubby t-shirts; crop tops; tops that look like undershirts; shirts advertising cigarettes, alcohol or drugs; shirts with obscene language or pictures and words with double meanings contrary to CCCS's Christian philosophy; swimming trunks; shorts and jeans with frayed edges; overalls; slippers; earrings; extreme hairstyles or unnatural colors.

MISCELLANEOUS ISSUES

Lunches and drinks are to be provided by the parents of enrolled students.

Photographs and/or digital photos are taken on campus of Summer School activities. Some of these photos are subsequently used by CCCS in publications, promotional materials, and electronic media. By enrolling in the Summer School program, parents/students give permission for their likenesses to be used in this manner.

Smoking is prohibited anywhere on the CCCS campus. Use of or possession of tobacco (any form), alcoholic beverages, or drugs on campus or on field trips is forbidden. Violation of this rule may result in dismissal.

VISITORS

Students may not bring other children to school as visitors. We request all adult visitors to register with the Staff in the School Office. Office hours are from 10:00am – 2:00pm. The school office will be closed for the month of July, summer school will still be in session.

SPECIAL NEEDS

CCCS is not equipped or able to attend to any special needs children due to the lack of adequate staff and facilities.

LET'S GO LEARN PROGRAM

- The minimum class size is ten students/maximum face-to-face class size is twenty students
- First Grade to Sixth Grade program is a face to face (mathematics and reading, mathematics, or reading).
- The child must be able to read proficiently for their grade level.
- Monday to Friday, 8am to 2pm (if child registers for TKDO they will be dismissed to attend that class)
- This is a computer-based program that assesses a student, and then builds a customized program to improve their mathematics and/or reading skills.
- Facilitator:
 - Mrs. Tammy Johnson has taught here for the past seven years. She began as an elementary teacher, for the past two years she has been teaching secondary grade level. Prior to her time in Hawaii she taught elementary, third grade and kindergarten, in Maine for three years, and prior to that she served as an elementary teaching assistant for five years. She received her Bachelor's Degree in Psychology from the University of Southern Maine in 2010, and just completed her Masters Degree in History from Liberty University in October 2022.

TAE KWONDO

- Open to students entering the 1st to 12th grades or continuing students of the CCCS TKDO program.
- No experience necessary.
- Instructor:
 - Nico Arcalas is a 2019 graduate of Calvary Chapel Christian School, and he is currently a student at Wayland Baptist University studying Criminal Justice Administration. He has been studying TKDO for approximately ten years and has a first-degree black belt through AIMMA. He is also a direct student of Grandmaster Hee Il Cho (https://aimma.com/about_gmcho.htm). Nico also holds a Gracie Jujitsu blue-belt and had trained in this art for approximately seven years.
- Training days and times:
 - Monday to Thursday; 1pm to 3pm
- Uniform
 - Continuing Students: TKDO t-shirt and gi pants
 - New Students: T-shirt and long knee length shorts
- Emphasizing character, discipline, and respect in accordance to God's Word, students will be taught the International Tae Kwon Do Federation (ITF) patterns, while developing cardiovascular health, hand and eye coordination, agility, balance, and self-defense. This program is an Action International Martial Arts Association (AIMAA) affiliated program associated with Grandmaster Hee Il Cho. The class will concentrate on conditioning, the basics of punches, kicks, and blocks as well as forms. Qualified students will be eligible to participate with a belt-promotion at the end of the summer session.
